

Arlington's two 13-and-older travel baseball organizations – Arlington Senators and Arlington Travel Baseball (ATB) – have joined forces to form one new organization, **"Arlington United Baseball**."

The program will provide more opportunities for Arlington players to play "big field" (60'/90') baseball in Arlington.

Ready for the fall 2024-2025 season, the program will provide multiple levels of baseball, starting this year at the 13U, 14U, and 15U levels.

Vision

To create an inclusive, community-based program that provides **competitive travel baseball opportunities** for teens to open pathways to high school baseball and beyond.

The multi-level program will develop and reinforce a positive sports culture that will promote the mental and emotional well-being of players as well as their physical development as ballplayers.

In addition to providing appropriate competitive baseball activities, United will work closely with the ASBR program to support recreational 60/90 baseball in Arlington.

Teams will practice and play on **Arlington fields**, play a competitive tournament and NVTBL schedule, and will be managed by coaches with experience at the pro, collegiate, and/or high school levels.

Players will be drawn primarily from Arlington. Those on the top two teams are not required to play recreational baseball, though are encouraged to do so.

Local team(s) will also play a competitive travel schedule, and players on these teams will participate in the ASBR spring league to maximize opportunities to develop and grow as ballplayers.

ASBR All Stars

Arlington United is partnered with Arlington Senior Babe Ruth.

Over the past decade, ASBR has had enormous success in putting together summer all-star teams that have competed and won at the national Senior Babe Ruth Tournament.

All travel players will be encouraged to play rec baseball, making them eligible for the ASBR All Star Teams.

The program will put together joint information sessions prior to the rec seasons so that parents and players who have been through the tournament can share their experiences with interested players and families.

Recreational baseball is the foundation of baseball in Arlington. ASBR will continue to provide opportunities for all eligible players to play, develop, and deepen their understanding of baseball.

Arlington United will work with the two youth leagues – Arlington Little League and Arlington Babe Ruth – to develop pathways to ensure that more players continue their baseball journey through the transition to the big field.

DBO and **Coaches**

Search underway for a Director of Baseball Operations, an individual with college coaching or senior high school experience.

- Organize schedules and tournaments
- Work with coaches on culture and curriculum
- Build out plans for winter workouts
- Down the road, help families understand college recruiting process and help players make connections with college coaches

Coaching Slate

• Building a slate of paid coaches, with significant pro, college and/or high school experience. Significant interest already from top-notch coaches

In Depth and Fair Tryout Process

- Run by DBO and Coaches, plus independent evaluators
- Players showcase skills as Pitchers, Catchers & IF and OF
- Players prohibited from wearing gear from previous teams

How many teams per age group?

 Depends on the number of players and depth of talent, but when fully built out, we hope to have ~3 teams per age group.
